

*continued as now classed in the Register Book with fresh record of docking 11,53 and the notation A.S. 11,53 subject to coaming plate of Engine Room aft. bhd, upper deck plating in parts, and inner surface of shell plating generally in holds and Engine Room being ~~being fit to carry~~ for pitting at the next Special Survey and as previously recommended, being fit to carry her usual cargoes.*
