Surveyed the M.V. "DRAKELOW", 313 tons gross of Cardiff, afloat on the 21st December, 1952 in the Import Dock, Blyth on account of shell leakage in the forward hold (port side), cause unknown,

and that I have transmitted to the Committee of Lloyd's Register of Shipping, London, a Report, stating that all ^{temporary} repairs recommended by me have been completed to my satisfaction, and

that I have Recommended that she be continued as classed in the Register Book without fresh record of survey, subject to shell stringer rivets (port side forward) being further examined and dealt with as found necessary, at the next drydocking, and to all other conditions at present attached to the vessel's class being dealt with as previously recommended,

being fit to carry her usual cargoes.
