Vessel examined in dry dock and Special Survey No. 2 carried out and to have record of survey 4,37 and the notation of S.S. No. 2-37.

Repairs:- 120 wood hatches and 10 tarpaulins renewed.
Hatch rest bars, battening bars, cleats, ring bolts and wedges renewed as required.
Storm boards, air pipe and vent coaming plugs and covers, door closing appliances, portlights, storm valves, engine skylight glasses, lifelines overhauled and repaired or renewed as necessary.
10 Gooseneck air pipes renewed.
