I duly received your letter of the 12th instant regarding the above and would explain that while this ship was accepted for the class BSp (Fishing Purposes) on the 9th March 1949 by the British Corporation, classification certificates were withheld pending payment of the outstanding Classification Survey fees which amounted in all to £118. 15. 0.

You will remember that in September 1949 when you advised us of your appointment as liquidator of the Owing Company, a copy of the account for this outstanding amount was sent you.

Since that time you have informed the British Corporation liquidator that you were not in a position to effect even partial payment so that the whole amount specified above, due to the British Corporation, remains unpaid.

Meantime the vessel's class has been qualified by a notation of "Laid up pending survey" in the Register Book, which of course warns interested parties that subsequent inspections have since become due, but on receipt of payment of the outstanding fees we shall be prepared to issue the original classification certificates under date of the 9th March 1949.
