"PERGAMON" ex "DANSTRIAN" of Hamburg ex Liverpool, 3527 tons gross, whilst vessel in dry dock at Liverpool, on the 10th March, 1950, and subsequently for the purpose of condition and change of Ownership.

The freeboard marks as embodied on the International Load Line Certificate No.53/7 issued by the British Corporation and which remains in force until the 16th April, 1951, are as follows:-

All repairs recommended by me have been completed to my satisfaction, and I will transmit to the Committee of Lloyd's Register of Shipping, London, a report recommending that the vessel be continued as now classed, with fresh record of docking survey, 3,50, but without special conditions, and being fit to carry her usual cargoes.
