This vessel placed on the blocks in dry dock & proper stages made. - The bottom examined after being scraped & cleaned and found satisfactory. - All close and spar ceiling removed in the holds, peaks & bunkers and the whole of the frames, stringers, hoods, floor plates, keelsons, engine & boiler bearers, ends of beams, web-tight - bulkheads, webs and inner surfaces of the plating exposed. All oxidation removed from the parts aforementioned & the same examined, found in order & afterwards coated. - The cement of the bottom throughout the ship examined & repaired where necessary. - All the listing taken down in the fore-castle & cabin and the shell plating in the way of the same chipped, examined, found satisfactory & afterwards coated. - The shell plates drilled
