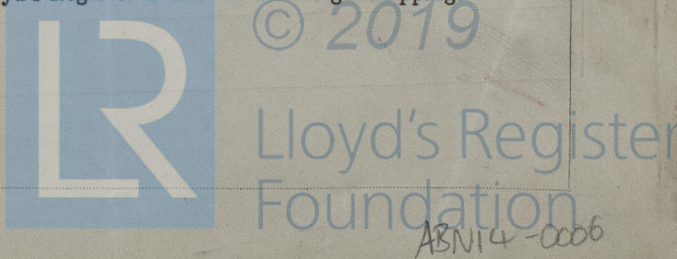
This vessel appears to be in good condition eligible in my opinion to remain as classed with a fresh record of 11/96 in the Reg Book.
