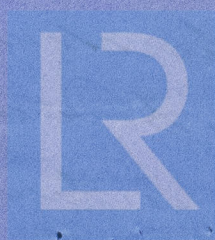
In reply to yours of the 18th Inst^t,
respecting the Brig Lady Franklin, of this
port. I beg to state I have by your request
carefully inspected the above Masted vessel
far as at present can be seen. Distings has
been cut out in various parts of Ceiling, between
beams & in Sawe held above the first futtocks
heads, exposing the frame timbers to view &
as to get the Seaming of the same, which
proved satisfactory wherever seen.

On account of the outside doubling
overing the beams & the through bedding
deck fastenings, I would be glad to know
how far authorised to survey for the
character contemplated. Every part of the
doubling is to be removed for the purpose
inspecting the deck through fastenings,
whether by introducing some extra through
fastenings from outside planking & some

extra hanging lines & three riders to
hold beams, though better & simpler
would be sufficient compensation, for
not disturbing the doubling to drive out
the old fastenings for inspection.

The owner would like to be
satisfied on these points before entering
into further repairs.
