Yours of the
28 Ult only landed to me
on my return from Banff
last night. And enciply by
to state that I am a Slave, &
signed the request for Special
Security and stated that the Agents
~~was~~ were to be built under
Security as he understood, but
that they had nothing to do in
any way with them.

It seems strange that the
makers of the Bygones should
refuse to pay the fees it must
be clear that the Burden of the
House should not be asked
to pay. I am told the
venue called on Monday
for Cardiff to Road coals.
Mr Hall is expected home
Tomorrow. Mr Hall so
tells me the Bygones have
squandered accounts with
them caterfactiously. I am
really sorry that there should

be so much trouble and diffi-
culty over this case. I do not
know more I could have done
yet I have been censured for
neglect of duty in this case.
Should another case of the
kind occur I shall see that
early intimation will be
given of deficiencies.
I had concluded in this
case that Circular 809
applied and that I should
have to see for myself whether
troubled by me, but I was
wrong. I hope the fees will

soon be paid that the case
may settle.
