Nature of Survey

Alterations and repairs.

This vessel is reported by the Aberdeen Surveyors to have been examined in dry dock, and the following alterations and repairs carried out;— A deep tank fitted aft, ^{and tested} accommodation for crew removed from forecastle to bridge, coaling hatches and shoots re-arranged, bridge deck renewed, new wheelhouse fitted, steering gear re-arranged and partly renewed, new steam windlass fitted, fore and afters and covers to hatchways renewed or repaired, bunkers altered. Under the boilers all tank girders, intercostal floors, most of the tank top plating, and the cement renewed. An extra bow anchor of proper test supplied, and various other ^{alterations} arrangements and repairs of a minor character carried out.

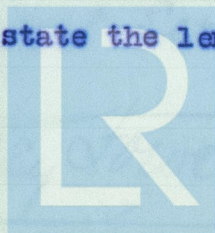
It is submitted the vessel is worthy to remain as classed, with record of survey as recommended, subject to the vessel being engaged exclusively in carrying coal, ore, or wood, while without cargo battens.
