Sir,

With reference to your letter of the 24th., instant respecting Mr. Dimmock's explanation of the delay in reporting the particulars of the new boiler recently fitted at Aberdeen on the Steam Trawler "CHANTICLEER", I beg to state that it appears that the report was not made out by Mr. Dimmock because he had not the information as to the name of the vessel for which the boiler was intended, nor the Port to which it had been forwarded, and this being known, he was not reminded that the report was overdue.

It was not until a request came from Aberdeen that Mr. Dimmock knew the name of the vessel into which this boiler had been fitted.

As explained by Mr. Dimmock in his letter of the 16th., instant it was unfortunate that the request from Aberdeen was overlooked by him.
