- "LYNDIANE EX ARMIDA ISSUE CERTIFICATE F  
"GALLOIS = Vessel classed (or re-classed) 100AI  
"GEGUND = subject to vessel being exclusively employed in carrying coal, wood or ore while without cargo battens  
"EXCEPT IN INSULATED CHAMBERS  
"RAMENTOS = classification certificate being forwarded  
"DECHANAND TONIGHT"

I have to add that certificates for the hull and machinery of this vessel are being sent tonight to Messrs. De Chanand & Cie of your port, the new Owners of the Steamer.


In issuing your certificate on Form F you will of course have made the condition as regards the absence of cargo battens to conform with Paragraph 6 of Section 42 of the current Rules.
