Dear Mr. Scott,

I duly received your letter of the 25th instant relating to the case of the steamer "ARMIDA" and acknowledged its receipt yesterday.

I have to-day had a conversation over the 'phone with Mr. Fowell at Aberdeen who informs me that there is nothing in the case calling for special attention. The vessel is being altered and fitted for carrying frozen cargoes and this has necessitated additions which he has submitted for approval.

At the same time she is being fitted with larger boilers and the removal of the old boilers is being attended, as is almost invariably the case, with repairs to the boiler seatings and the keelsons in way of same. Mr. Fowell knows of nothing exceptional nor does anything point to neglect at the last survey which was held at Ardrossan. I have had a conversation with Mr. Wright, who surveyed the vessel at Ardrossan two years ago, and he has shown me his survey report. It seems quite clear that Mr. Wright's survey was held in his usual careful manner and there is no reflection on him.

In these circumstances I am returning to London to-morrow.
