

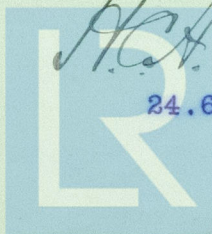
s.s. "ARMIDA" (ex "Greendyke")

The above named vessel was built in 1883 and underwent  
and S.S.No.3 at Ardrossan in 1911. She has recently been  
purchased by Messrs. de Chanaud & Co. of Havre, and is at  
present undergoing alterations at Aberdeen to fit her for the  
carrying of frozen meat. As the engines are being tripled,  
boilers of higher pressure are being fitted.

During my recent visit to Aberdeen, Mr. Fowell, in  
the course of conversation, stated that upon the old boilers  
being removed the vessel in way of the same was found to be  
in a seriously wasted condition, to remedy which will increase  
the cost of repairs largely beyond what the purchasers had  
anticipated, in view of the vessel having been submitted to  
and S.S.No.3 so recently as 1911; and they feel strongly that  
they have been misled.

As the case seems to be one of some importance, I  
think it well to report the circumstances as communicated to  
me.
