Extracts from the Rules of the Society respecting Engines & Boilers:—

The machinery and boilers of all steam ships are to be surveyed annually practicable, and in addition to be submitted to a Special Survey every four years upon the occasion of the vessels undergoing the Special periodical Surveys Nos. 2, and 3, prescribed in the Rules, and the boilers to Special Survey when six years old, and subsequently to Annual Survey.

In the event of either the machinery or boilers appearing to be impaired such an extent as renders it desirable that either or both be specially surveyed within the periods prescribed above, a Certificate for either machinery or boiler for a limited period will be granted according to the nature of the case.
