*Steel bushes on the middle pintholes to make them up to the size required by Rules, which was agreed to by the Committee.*

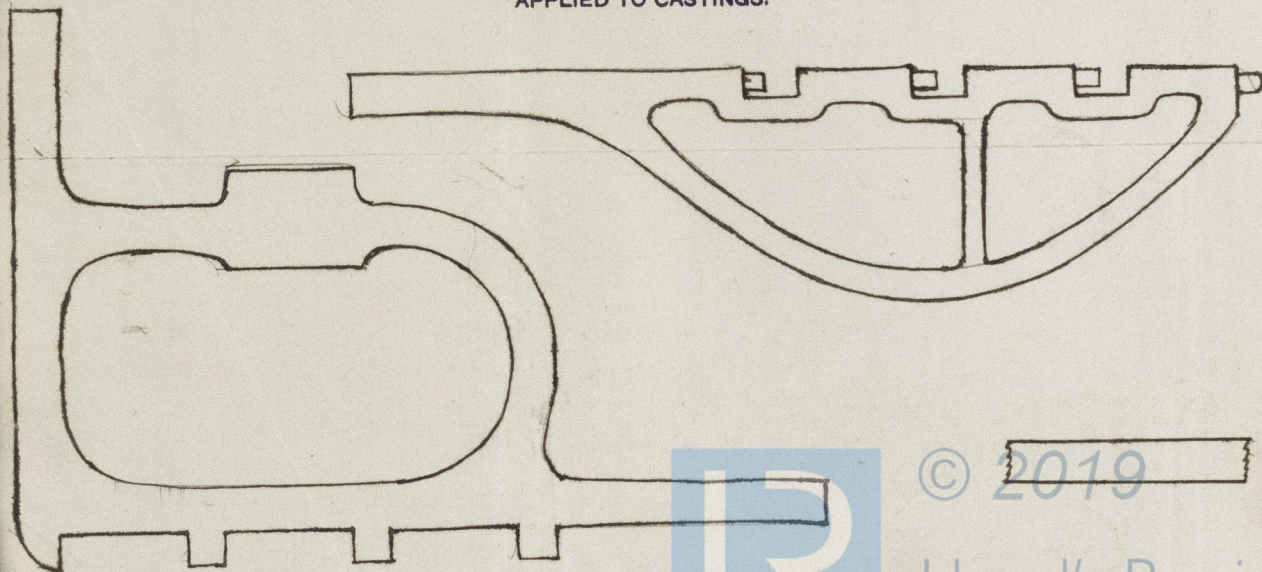
