Steel bushes on the rudder pintles to make them up to the size required, which was agreed to by the Committee.

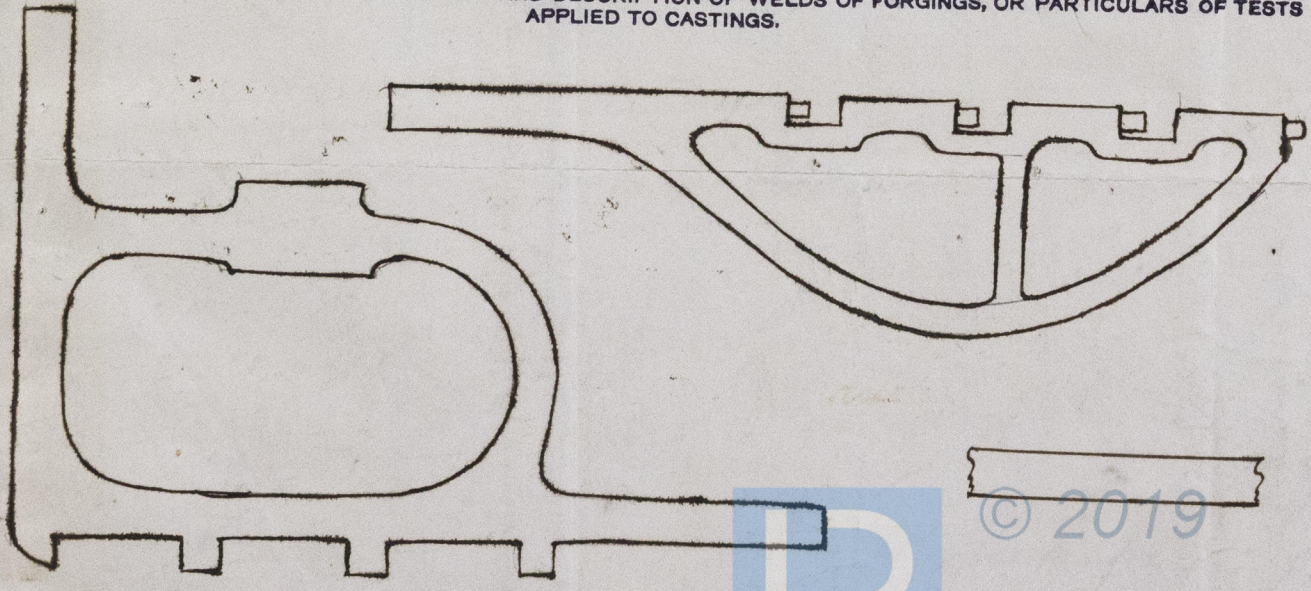

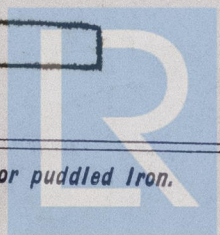
