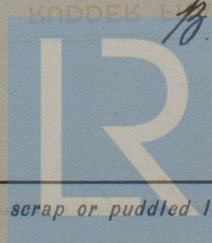
The above casting was subjected to the usual drop and hammering tests with satisfactory results
