The lower part of this stem frame has been dropped, and each part, subjected to hammering, tensile, and bend tests, in accordance with the Rules of this Society, with good results; for which see sheet attached.

Owing to its peculiar shape the upper part of stem frame was not dropped, but has been well hammered and examined.
