

Steel Vessel S.S. "Kamchatka Bay", 1700,  
3005 tons net register on the question of  
ascertaining the amount and nature of the  
damage stated to have been sustained while  
launching on the 25<sup>th</sup> December 1896, and  
through grounding in the river Clyde on  
the 2<sup>nd</sup> of February 1897.

For particulars see Protest.

The examination was taken off  
Glasgow, on the second day of March 1899  
and subsequently the undersigned found  
the third plate upon stem, a both Port and  
Starboard sides in 3 or 4 places indentated  
along the launching edge, the cement in one  
of same broken. The bottom otherwise un-  
injured.

No impression could be obtained  
of the third plate being  
broken in both port and

faired in place, and the cement, in  
way of same be made good, all as to  
place this vessel in the same good and  
efficient condition as she was previous  
to sustaining the aforementioned damage.
