Dear Sirs:

Our inspector Mr J A Thompson has seen
on this morning together with a representative
of the Londonderry Shipbuilding C. about the
"Marte" (ex Parkside) now being completed
Glasgow, which we are going to take over.
We understand that, through some defect, the
star peak tank is not in a fit condition to
passed by you and it will have, of course, to
put right by the builders to your satisfaction.
The work, however, might delay the delivery of
the ship for some days, and this would be
easily prejudicial to our interests as ^{the} cancelling
of the charter already effected would
certainly be missed.

To avoid a considerable loss, it is
easily urgent for us that the steamer should
proceed to Newport (Mon) without
delay, and

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whilst there do all the necessary work to put the tank in proper condition. We therefore beg to ask you whether, for the purposes of classification, it will be good enough to forego for the present your requirements as to the after peak tank.

Of course, the tank will not be used whilst not passed by you, and we hereby give you our undertaking to that effect. Moreover, to insure its not being used in its present defective condition, we have ordered the filling pipes to be blank flanged and have just had a telegram from Glasgow as follows:

"Fitting flange in peak tank. Our report follows."

We may mention that with the bunkers and the water ballast in the double bottom, the steamer has 650 tons extra slag ballast, and is in such trim that the after peak tank would in any case be used on her voyage from the Clyde to Newport.
