the 28<sup>th</sup> June.


On examining the vessel while lying  
alongside the Applegarth Wharf in this  
port on the 2<sup>nd</sup> July found on the star-  
board on the Port side, directly under the  
fore hatch, the cement broken in five spar  
from bows bent vertically just outside the  
outer girder angle, and a few rents blan-  
in the double bottom angles and outer  
gas plate bottom.

Recommended that the vessel  
be placed in dry dock as early as convenient  
for further examination; that the re-  
suits in the neighbourhood of

inside and outside. Be carefully tested, and  
examined where necessary, and the beams and  
bulbs of plating examined, and accounted  
where damaged; that the best floors be joined  
in place, the damage repaired, where bottom  
is cut out for cargo, and the new and  
disturbed work painted so as to place the  
vessel in as good condition as she was in  
before the damage occurred.
