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two or three days, I thought it better to return to my duties at Cardiff. The master recommended Messrs Holland & Wolff's manager after making the ship practically tight to wine the Cardiff surveyors; when I would return and examined & sound the ship and if found satisfactory would issue a report that in my opinion the vessel was in a seaworthy condition to be towed to Belfast for permanent repairs. It is respectfully submitted, that these arrangements were made subject to the approval of the Committee.

The two ten inch salvage pumps have been fitted on board and are used in pumping out the ship.
