The Belfast Surveyors report that this vessel has been examined in dry dock. A recess has been made in the forward boiler room bulkhead to receive a new auxiliary boiler. Refrigerating machinery fitted on the top of deep tank abaft engine room. Nos 1, 2, 3 & 4 holds & tween decks insulated throughout. Bilge keels now fitted.

It is submitted the vessel appears worthy to remain as classed, with record of survey 7.02 Bel. as recommended.
