N<sup>o</sup>. 1. The depth is of course 16' 2 1/2."

N<sup>o</sup>. 2. The main deck stringer plate is 38' 1 1/2" for  
1/2 Length as approved.

N<sup>o</sup>. 3. The tensile strain of the chain cable per  
certificate of test, shall be stated as soon as  
I have got this certificate from the builder.

N<sup>o</sup>. 4. Instead of a stream chain a 75 fms.  
4" steel wire has been supplied.

As soon as I have taken the necessary measure-  
ment for the assignment of freeboard, I shall for-  
ward the freeboard Rp. together with the request of  
freeboard.

At the same time They hereby to ask you, if you  
will immediately wire your approbation,  
to me, as the vessel cannot leave Fvrig before  
Approbation.
