

Affidavit

June 9th 1900

George Westcott

Myrs G. Cuper & Co. Llyds agents
of Bideford having the S.S. Hemington of
Liverpool of 344 tons Regt

On the 1st June 1900 10 P.M. loaded with a
Cask of China Clay from Hemington bound to
Westm Point. the said vessel with a Pilot in
charge, and coming out around Hemington
Rock, caught a mind on the tide when
she washed considerably, lengthened the ship
of 65 ft. of Clay.

Panted. The warp away to set her off,
but with difficulty

This is certified from the Llyds Book

on Tuesday the 5th at 11 A.M. I visited the
S.S. S. S. Hemington in company with Mr. G. H.
Bates & Cuper & Co. M&A, with them in question
and found the vessel lying low on the
tide. And overhanging about 50ft and
laying badly after picking the ship being
lengthened floated off on the 4th of June 1900

and forwarded to Appledore Island where
the Ship could be partially surveyed
except the bottom as that was laying
in the Sand. Could see no indication
of spraining either a deck or the Side
loaded the Clay taken out when
forwarded to sea on the 8th June 1900.

Recommend that the vessel be placed
either in dry dock or laid down for the
further examination of the bottom.
The Propeller removed and fresh fitted
as it is not in a satisfactory state.
The out on the off side is slack and the
Propeller not properly tight on the shaft
probably loosened while ship was the
ground with working in the sand
and that 3 New Hamps supplied of
60 fathom each of 5 Mandella
