Sir

I have to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 5th Inst, requesting me to describe the spacing of the Hold-beams in the Barge Vess the number appearing but scanty; I beg leave to say, that there are 12 Holdbeams, and three beams under the Cabin deck. That run in a parallel direction. 14 inches above the Hold-beams and may be considered as Hold-beams, having a shelf piece and a hanging beam from knee to each beam; the shortest space is 3 feet 10 inches, the longest 4 feet 10 inches.
