Dear Sir,

Our firm have now building  
at Bridgewater, under special survey  
by Mr Congdon, a Brig, intended for  
the 13th class in your Book! - This  
vessel was contracted for last year,  
and should have been finished and  
delivered up to us on the first of this  
month, but from circumstances over  
which we had no control, the Builder  
will be some eight or nine weeks  
behind his time. The chains and  
anchors for the vessel were ordered  
in January last, and are made,  
tested, and ready for the ship. Will  
you kindly inquire, at the meeting  
of the Board to-morrow, whether  
under these circumstances, the  
Committee will not consider that  
their Rule in regard to Chains &  
Anchors

is complied with, the chains and  
anchors being supplied previous  
to the first of July, although the  
cladding of the vessel will be de-  
layed a few weeks after that date.  
We have purchased the chains  
and anchors from Messrs. Bell and  
Daniel, with whom and their pre-  
decessors we have done business  
for many years, and we do not  
remember having had to complain  
of one of their chains having parted,  
or an anchor having broken. -  
We may add that the chains  
and anchors purchased for the  
Vig are in excess of your require-  
ments, in point of size & weight.
