Sir.

I beg leave to advise you that
Messrs Summers & Scott Gloucester
demand to pay the Fees now due for the
Survey of the hull and Machinery of their
"No 59" Steel S. Bristol Report No 5555.
and I enclose a letter received from
them together with the Audit notes for
both the vessels referred to. I would
explain that at the interview I had
with the Principals at my visit to the
Works on the 6th inst it was pointed out
to them that we were instructed by
the Committee to charge an entry fee
in the case of all first entry reports
on both hull and Machinery. Please
see

see your enclosing letter of the 28th October last. As regards the remarks in the enclosed letter as to the fee paid by Messrs. Newall for the survey and test of the boiler for 1859. I would point-out that a similar fee would doubtless be charged in the case of 1858. S. S. "Bee" Bristol Report 185840 the boiler of which vessel was made under the survey of the Society's Surveyor at Hull.

I would respectfully suggest that considering that no first-entry fees were charged in the case of the *Prince Rupert* and that these Steamers are indeed of small size and tonnage the remarks in the letter enclosed are worthy of the Committee's favorable consideration.
