On account of damage by grounding :- Vessel examined in dry dock : 2 rudder pintles renewed : cement ^{partly} examined, and ceiling re-fitted.

With the exception of the removal of the close ceiling, from 8 frame spaces abaft fresh water tanks to the peak bulkhead, the examination of the peak and the shell plating in way of side lights, and the removal of the mast wedges, the requirements of the Second S.S.No.3, due 6.93, and the Sixth Periodical Survey have now been complied with.


It is submitted the vessel appears worthy to remain classed *A1, and A1*1 in red, as recommended, without fresh record,

as recommended. The Surveyor states the vessel is now Rigged as a Barque & has only one deck laid, the records in the Register Book should therefore be amended.
