Iron Bk "John O'Gaunt" of  
Liverpool, 1237 tons, to ascertain  
the extent of damage stated to have  
been sustained by grounding in the  
Shannon, August 31<sup>st</sup> and Sept 5<sup>th</sup> 1893, when on her late voyage from  
Lisaburne towards Limerick.

For full particulars  
see Log book.

Attended Oct 29<sup>th</sup> and  
subsequent dates, the vessel lying  
in Hill's dry dock at this port,  
and on careful examination found  
the bottom and Keel much rubbed  
and bare of paint. - On port side  
found a score about forty feet in  
length, in the thick strake from  
Keel, extending from about the  
foremast towards aft, and the  
udder apparently shaken.



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Recommended to lift the rudder for further examination, and to lift the ceiling hatches, from main hatchway forward, for examination of the cement. When thus prepared for survey found two of the rudder pintles loose; the cement was found intact.

Recommended to renew the two damaged pintles of rudder, to place the rudder again in position, and connect the steering gear; to repair the ceiling hatches, and to paint the bottom, so as to place the vessel in as efficient condition as before the accident.
