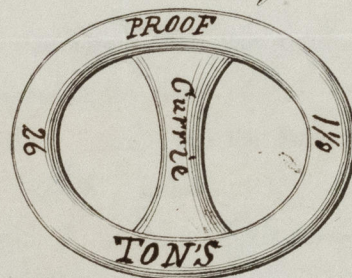


Greenock, 16th July 1847

We hereby certify, that we have supplied the
Brig Spray Capt. Paul of Greenock belonging to
Messrs. John & M^cBride here with Chains and Anchors as under
 noted; that the Chain Cables have been subjected to proof strains
 as follow, viz. —

The $1\frac{1}{8}$ inch Chain to a strain of 26 Tons, the $1\frac{1}{8}$ inch Chain to a
 strain of 26 Tons, and the $\frac{3}{4}$ inch Chain to a strain of 10 Tons, and
 that on the last link of each fifteen fathoms the proof strain is
 marked as per margin. —
