

Steel four masted barquentine "SACHSEN" No. 40 in the Register Book,
built at Stavanger in 1894.

Rule dimensions : 181.41 x 30.24 x 15.12

Scantling numbers : 56.76 and 10296

Proportions : Length = 5.99 Breadths = 11.99 Depths.

This vessel is classed in the Norwegian Veritas, and it is now desired
that she should be classed 100A1, "Steel", in this Society's Register
Book.

She is now in the Passage West dry dock at Queenstown, undergoing
repairs consequent on an explosion of coal gas.

Sketches of midship section and profile have been submitted by Messrs.
Scullard & Attridge, who have verified the scantlings and found them
to compare favourably with the Rule requirements.

It is submitted that provided the vessel be surveyed in accordance
with Section 47 of the Rules, for vessels not built under Survey,
and be found or placed in good condition, and on completion of the
Survey be favourably reported upon she will be worthy of the favour-
able consideration of the Committee to be classed 100A-, "Steel".

Particulars of the testing of steel used in the construction of the
vessel should be furnished for the information of the Committee.

To entitle the vessel to the figure 1, the equipment should be in
accordance with Section 22 of the Rules.
