We have duly received your favour of the 21st. inst., and thank you for writing us in the friendly manner you do, but would point out to you that your Surveyors, who are usually in touch with our work, were aware that, as customary with us, we were anticipating the work required for the remaining parts of the survey, and would have had same completed by our own Shore Staff had we not been forced by your threat of withdrawal of Class to give the remainder of the work to our contractors at Dublin.

We quite realize the position which your Committee are obliged to take up as regards Shipowners in general, but surely their rules are not so exacting that they are bound to enforce the drastic powers which they possess, with firms who usually anticipate the Surveys of their steamers, on an occasion under exceptional circumstances when the limit of time has been exceeded.

We thank you, however, for the remarks in the concluding paragraph of your letter, and we can assure you that, although we did feel sore over the pressure put upon us on this occasion, we feel satisfied that the consideration which we have always received from your


