Dear Sir,

With further reference to your letter dated 11th inst., we have pleasure in giving you the required information regarding the motor fitted in Schooner "Olwen".

We are sending you under separate cover a set of drawings giving the information you ask for.

With regard to the forging, this was made by Messrs Eva Bros., Crabtree Forge, Clayton, Manchester. The specification to which they work is that the steel is to have an ultimate tensile strength of 28 to 32 tons per square inch, an elastic limit of not less than 50% of the ultimate strength, an elongation of 30% in two inches, and is not to contain more than .05% of either sulphur or phosphorous.


