Being informed by Mr. Burn of St. Andrews, the owner of the small wood screw steamer building at Anstruther, designated No 14, that the vessels boiler, constructed at Gloucester, does not meet the requirements of the Rules, as per letter herewith enclosed, I shall be glad if you will please to acquaint me for my guidance, whether the vessel will be deemed eligible for the Class I A "For Fishing Purposes only", omitting the figure 1, which was originally contemplated, or whether no class can be assigned to her on account of the deviations from the Rules in the construction of the boiler. -
