REPAIRS Stripped the Yellow Metal Sheathing, and Rubbed the Bottom
Renewed the Fore Length of Keel with American Elm Originally Bolted
with Iron and now Bolted with Yellow Metal Bolts, New False Keel 4 inches
Eleven New Planks on the Starboard Bow and Two on the Starboard Bow
Two Lower Breasthooks taken off and Bolted with Yellow Metal,
New Upper Rudder Band and other refastened
Painted over all and Sheathed the Bottom with Yellow Metal over
Felt to the Middle of the Wake
