This special survey was commenced in November 1881, (Glasgow Report No. 5567), and has now been completed as follows:- Portions of the cement cut out to ascertain its condition and that of the frames and keel plate, as per section 43. The metal sheathing stripped off, the bottom caulked from the metal sheathing line to the keel, and afterwards re-sheathed with yellow metal on felt. The main lower topsail yard repaired.
