This vessel having been in collision with Dublin pier head on the 20th December 1883, the following repairs have now been done:

On the port bow - one fore-castle side plate (upper strake) part renewed, one plate (in the strake next below) faired in place, 3 frames part renewed above the upper deck with the bolts efficiently shifted and properly strapped; a length of iron moulding renewed, a few started rivets in 2 of the fore-castle beam knees renewed, and the port side of the fore-castle deck caulked.
