REPAIRS, OR EXAMINATION AS PER RULE, FOR damage caused by heavy weather from the 15th to the 26th of January 1896 when in a light condition on a voyage from Glasgow to Baltimore (see also Baltimore Report p. 620)

sixteen vertical angles connecting bracket floors to margin plate of No. 1 tank on the starboard side and seventeen on the port side being started and rivets loose have now been riveted one of them on each side being renewed; bracket plates have been fitted at heel of two web frames to tank top in way of No. 1 tank and also to five ordinary frames on each side of vessel an additional angle fitted to top of bracket floors of ordinary frames to receive the bracket plates. Seven floors on starboard side and four on the port side at fore end of No. 1 tank riveted to frames angles and cement in way of same renewed. The suction pipes to fore peak tank and No. 1 tank being broken near tank division now repaired. The angle connecting margin plate of No. 1 tank to shell was recutted.
