Main boiler and mountings examined, and found in fair condition; the sides of the furnaces, at line of firebars, are somewhat reduced by corrosion and the furnace seams are a little sprung at the connection to tube plates. Several rivets have been renewed at seam of port for² furnace, and some caulking has been done at those parts.

Donkey boiler examined and found in fair condition. Several patches at the firebar bottom seams were caulked.

General Observations, Opinion, and Recommendation:— The machinery of this vessel (State clearly what alteration, if any, is suggested to be made in the existing classification of the vessel's machinery in the Register Book, consequent upon this survey, and also any alteration required to be made in the records of the vessel's machinery, boilers, working pressures, &c.: thus, for example, B.S. 0,95, B.&M.S. 0,95 or L.M.C. 0,95, 140 lb., F.D., &c.) as far as seen, in my opinion is in safe working condition, and will be eligible for record B.S. 10-96 in the Register Book, on completion of Survey.


