Sir

I duly received your letter of the 14th inst.
during reference to the I.S.S. Amateur of Bayonne -
also the enclosures. -

This steamer was in good condition when I have seen
her in the dry dock at Bayonne, so far it was possible
to examine her for the keel and bottom.

The inside was very dirty and the master
said he had order of the english purchaser not to clean it?

When Mons^r Henri Mouret passed through Bordeaux
on the 5th inst. he has paid me, and he has advised me
"M. M. Colvis Lowden & Co." have taken possession of that
steamer, and that before her departure they have required
of M^r "Andrian" the late owner, a sum of £150
(which has been paid) objecting the ship was not any more
cleared? and when at Glasgow it was necessary to make
her examined and repaired under the Lloyd's Surveyors
superintendence ?? -

to me and the copy of my reply to him -
