letter of the 25th Inst. regarding
the Report N^o 14671 on the S.S.
"Scotoman" we now beg to forward
herewith extracts from the Log
Book relating to the damage
referred to.

And we beg to inform you
that the Captain states that
the Tank (Fore Peak) was empty
on the voyage from Lerwick to Weston
Point and Liverpool, and he
further states that the vessel strikes
heavier in the sea when tank is
full and holds empty.

When light in a "choppy"
head sea the mast-head and
side lights are sometimes ex-
tinguished by the vessel
striking
