 in way of plate removal, and afterwards to replace
 piece, side light, & plate, or make good the portion
 of plate removed in any way best to restore work
 lining; the top and base of water closet to be re-
 moved as before; the paintwork of room to be removed
 clean and also the same removed and afterwards painted
 two coats of paint so that the result may be the same
 as the same good and efficient condition as
 the was in before the damage occurred.
