Dear Sirs,

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 8th instant respecting the classification in the Society's Register Book of your steamer "OCAMO", and having been in communication with the Society's office at Glasgow in the matter I have to acquaint you that it appears that the requirements of the Society's Rules for the Second Special Survey No.3 were complied with upon the occasion of the survey held in June 1900, except as regards the <sup>removal of the</sup> ~~timber~~ and close ceiling at the bilge and the drilling strakes of the plating above the cement. Provided this requirement be now complied with, and the vessel be reported by the Society's Surveyors to be in good condition she will be eligible to be recommended to the Committee for notation of S.S.2nd.No.3-6,00, in which case she will become due for the next Special Survey (Special Survey No.1) in June 1904.

Perhaps you will kindly let me know what steps you propose taking in the matter?
