Dear Sirs,

We have this morning received the details of the tonnage of the "Tinto Hill" from the Board of Trade, from which we see the under deck tonnage exceeds 2000 tons. I have enclosed an extract from our letter to you dated 29th December last, in which the rigging as at present fitted was approved, subject to the under deck tonnage being below 2000 tons. Will you please inform me what you propose to do under these circumstances?

Extract from Mr. Fowling's letter to you on the 29th dec^r. last, regarding this case:—

"I am to add that if the under
"deck tonnage is 2000 tons, or
"above, the sizes of the rigging
"should be in accordance with
"Table G. 9 for vessels from 1600
"to 1800 tons under deck.

"The Committee direct me to
"mention this, in order to
"present any disappointment
"in regard to the classification
"of the vessels [Nos. 179 & 183]
"upon completion."
