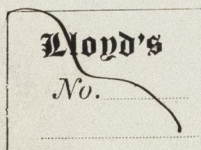

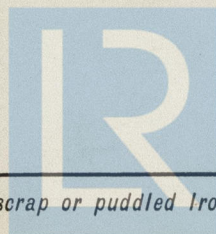

This casting was dropped from a clear height of eight feet
then suspended & hammered giving no indication of
defect.

A test piece turned 1 inch diam was bent
through an angle of 90° without cracking.
