a few weeks ago by a firm at Lakeshead. I then procured a table from Lloyd's.

I have asked Lloyd's to pass it in this instance, as, if I have to replace it, it will mean a serious loss to me, as I scarcely sell any cables this size & it may lie on my hands for years. I have no wish whatever to ignore

their Rules & Regulations, but in this instance it was done in ignorance.

Can you do anything to get me out of the difficulty, if so I should be extremely obliged.

I would meet you in any way I could, so as to get them passed.

It is a very unfortunate affair for me, I can assure you. Kindly do what you can in the matter and
