In answer to your enquiry of yesterday's date with reference to the drain cocks for the main steam pipes of the S. S. Langhank, I beg to state that under the circumstances I do not consider that the machinery class of this vessel should be withheld as there is no likelihood of a mishap occurring except on the occasions of opening the stop valves, and the Chief Engineer in Charge was from his own observations fully alive to the danger to which he would expose himself if he were to open them carelessly.
