Dear Sir,

We beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 22nd instant regarding the equipment of the steamer "SOLGLIMT", and with reference thereto I beg to state that the actual mean diameters of the 21 lengths of chain cables at present onboard is $2 \frac{17}{32}$ " minimum and $2 \frac{11}{16}$ " maximum.

I have yesterday discussed the matter with the Owners' representative here, Dr. Danckert Smith, who is, I am sorry to say, at present in hospital with a broken leg, and he proposed to take the two bower anchors ashore, weighing 84.1.22 and 83.3.11 respectively, and place two new stockless anchors of 100 cwts. each onboard.

It was also proposed to remove the stream anchor and use the smallest bower anchor as stream.

It is further proposed to place 17 fathoms of $2 \frac{11}{16}$ " chain cable onboard.

Dr. Smith states that it is very seldom that the anchors on a vessel in whaling service are being used.
